

Liberal Votes by Chris Sneed

Seven-year incumbent Chris Sneed has built a record of votes that repeatedly conflict with the values of this district. This flier shows only a small fraction of a much larger pattern.

In 2025, the Oklahoma Grassroots Index (OkGrassroots.com) found Sneed voted in line with the Republican platform just 51% of the time.

Seven years is more than enough evidence. If Sneed chooses to govern from the left — siding with liberal positions on nearly half of the most important votes — he should do so in a district that agrees with him, not in House District 14, a community grounded in strong conservative principles.

It's time to elect a leader whose actions match his promises — someone who will consistently defend our values not just in speeches, but where it matters most: every single vote cast on our behalf.

SB 511 **Green Lighting Addiction. Sneed Voted to Give Needles to Drug Users**

When Chris Sneed voted to authorize a program that distributes free drug paraphernalia under the banner of “harm reduction,” also known as “*The Party in a Box*,” he helped send a dangerous message: **illegal drug use would be tolerated — and even facilitated — by the state.**

Only later, after the consequences became clear, did Sneed vote against extending the program's sunset. That reversal raises a serious question: why did it take years to recognize the damage of a policy he originally supported? This was not a harmless procedural vote. The original authorization was a leadership moment — a chance to stand firmly for recovery, accountability, and treatment. Instead, Sneed enabled a program many families saw as normalizing addiction at the height of Oklahoma's drug crisis.

Our district deserves a representative who gets it right the first time — someone who does not experiment with dangerous left wing policy, more fitting of Seattle than Oklahoma, then try to walk it back after the harm is done.

HB 1571 **Giving Eternal Life to The Cow Food Vending Machine Program**

Chris Sneed voted to extend the fund that funded a Cow Food Vending Machine, giving permanent life support to a government program that operates with an off-the-top funding stream — money that bypasses the normal legislative appropriation process and avoids real oversight. Programs structured this way are exactly where waste thrives.

That same fund has already paid for absurd projects: a cow food vending machine, a “*bridge to nowhere*” that can't even carry vehicle traffic, and resort signage placed on private property — all at taxpayer expense. The program is burning roughly six million dollars a year, and Sneed's vote helps guarantee that this waste doesn't stop — it becomes embedded for years to come.

SJR 34

Blue Judges - Ruling Over Red Oklahoma: Sneed Voted to Protect Liberal Bar Association's Power Over Our Judicial Nominations

An archaic Oklahoma law allows the unelected, notoriously liberal Oklahoma Bar Association to appoint five members of the state panel that nominates judges. This has created a red state with a blue judiciary dynamic—where Oklahomans are often judged by individuals who do not share their values. Rather than siding with the people's right to vote on ending this skewed system, Sneed voted to preserve it. He sided with liberal lawyers over the citizens he was elected to represent and wouldn't even let the people of Oklahoma have a vote on the matter. This is the tyranny of the few overruling the will of the many. As lawmakers debated the bill, Oklahoma's leading right-to-life organization pleaded with legislators to let the people vote, citing the wave of radical pro-choice judges being placed on the bench. Sneed turned a deaf ear to those pleas and to this day, the unelected liberals maintain their power.

Legislating While You Slept: Sneed Was the Deciding Vote to Approve Midnight Voting

In an abdication of long-standing tradition, Sneed voted to suspend the rules and allow the House to meet and vote after midnight. It is believed to likely be the first time this has occurred in at least 20 years—and the first time Republican representatives have suspended this important rule. The measure passed by just one vote. Because of Sneed's vote, the House was conducting business while, we the people, slept, taking important votes that affect all of us, until nearly 2 a.m. As the saying goes, nothing good happens after midnight.

Woke Mandating on Local Control of Education

Sneed voted for a liberal Democrat's bill to impose a top-down state mandate on local school districts by stripping them of authority over how early childhood classrooms are run. The law explicitly forbids districts from restricting "play-based" learning, overriding the judgment of locally elected school boards and the parents they represent. Communities that prefer a more structured, academically focused approach are legally blocked from setting their own standards. This vote shifted power away from families and local educators and handed it to the state, embedding a woke, one-size-fits-all teaching philosophy into Oklahoma law and weakening the principle of local control that our education system was built on.

Sneed State Sticker Mandate: Siding With Regulation Over Personal Responsibility

Chris Sneed required government-approved warning stickers on privately owned boats. The law forces vessel owners to comply with a Capitol-designed labeling requirement and directs state agencies to print and distribute materials at taxpayer expense. Instead of trusting manufacturers, boat owners, and common-sense safety practices, the Sneed imposed a blanket rule that treats every owner the same and expands bureaucratic control over personal property. It's a small example of a bigger pattern: decisions that could be handled locally or privately are increasingly dictated from the state level, adding layers of regulation and cost while growing government's footprint in everyday life.
